

# **CITY CENTER EIR SCOPING MEETING FAQ**

## **What is a “scoping meeting”?**

A scoping meeting is a meeting where the public, interested parties and public agencies have the opportunity to offer comments on what environmental topics should be covered in the forthcoming Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for the City Center Mixed-Use Project.

## **Is the scoping meeting a public hearing?**

While the scoping meeting is open to the public, it is not a formal public hearing. The sole purpose of the meeting is to accept comments on the scope of the forthcoming EIR.

## **What will be decided at this meeting?**

No decisions will be made nor actions taken at this meeting.

## **Do I have to attend the scoping meeting if I want to make comments on the scope of the EIR?**

City staff and the City’s environmental consultant will provide a brief overview of the proposed project and summary of the environmental topics to be studied in the forthcoming EIR. Once this brief presentation is completed, all interested parties will have the opportunity to comment on the scope of the forthcoming EIR.
